Information for new Welcome Ministry Volunteers



Thank you for your interest in becoming a volunteer for the Welcome Ministry in your parish during COVID-19.

This leaflet will provide some important safeguarding information about your new role.

There are important steps you need to complete before starting as a volunteer in this role:

- Contact your Parish Priest to obtain an application form.
- If you are a current volunteer in your parish, working with children or vulnerable groups, please complete Application Form A.
- If you have never volunteered before, please complete Application Form B.
- Complete the online safeguarding training available on the SCSS website.
- Obtain more information from your parish co-ordinators about what you will be expected to do.

Main duties of the Welcome Ministry:

- to be a welcoming face of the parish community
- to assist people to enter the Church safely
- to guide people to restricted seating areas in the church
- to assist people to exit the Church building safely
- to be aware that some people might wish to talk to you when they come to Church
- to be aware that some people might become distressed and need support, caused by their recent experience of isolation.

NB. The particular tasks will vary from church to church.

PLEASE BE ALERT

If anyone shares with you about:

- any harm they have suffered
- anyone known to them who has been harmed
- themselves being at risk in any way
- someone known to them being at risk.

Refer immediately to your Parish Priest or Parish Safeguarding Co-ordinator.

It might then be vitally important that you seek the advice of the Diocesan Safeguarding Adviser.

It is important that the individual is provided with support.

The Catholic Church in Scotland has a Mandatory Reporting Policy and all criminal allegations are reported to the statutory authorities.
